WHAT IS OPEN STUDIOS?


Open Studios is an event for Santa Cruz County visual artists. Artists open up their studios and share their art & creative process with the public. Artists must be permanent residents of Santa Cruz County.

The tour takes place the first three weekends of October.

This is the 40th year of the tour!








As an Open Studios artist, you get to

WHAT KIND OF Support do We Give to Artists?

All first-time participants are offered one-on-one **mentoring** from a veteran Open Studios artist.

A **private resources website** filled with support documents covering all aspects of the tour (see right)



HOW MUCH ART DO I NEED TO HAVE TO APPLY? HOW MUCH ART DO I NEED ON OPENING DAY?

In order to apply, you will need high quality digital images of **seven individual pieces of art** created between 2022 and the present that represent a cohesive body of work that shows technical proficiency in **one selected medium**.



How much artwork do I need to have completed by the start of the tour?

On opening day you need to have a minimum of **fifteen original pieces** in the selected medium under which you were juried on hand for the public to see.



WHAT ARE THE JUROF LOOKING FOR?

The jurors review and score each application by medium using a scale of 1-5, applying the following **criteria**:

- **Technical Proficiency:** The images show expertise in a given medium.
- **Cohesive Body of Work:** The body of work looks like it was created by the same artist, reflecting their personal creativity and voice.

Make sure you aren't showing a multitude of voices, techniques, and styles in your selections for your body of work. You will be able to show ALL of your artistic voices and art in different mediums during the tour.

For our application you must curate a selection of seven images that reflect a cohesive voice in your one chosen medium.

Consistency: applies to all media categories

- Make sure that all of your images have a consistent feel and look.
- A consistent theme, lighting, background, subject, etc., will make your submission appear professional.

Consistency examples:



Artwork photography

Your digital images are your *only* voice with the jurors. They don't know if you're new to the field or if you've been making art for decades.

You can take your own photographs or hire someone to take them for you. A list of local professionals is on page 4 of the Guidelines.

If you take your own photos for the application, please keep the following tips in mind:



Lighting:

- · Lighting is an important factor when photographing your work.
- Be sure that your camera is set and white-balanced for your lighting conditions.
- Small shifts of light can dramatically bring out the details in your work.
- Play with different angles.
- Avoid hot spots if at all possible.

Lighting examples:

Exposure:

- Bracket your photographs and take multiple exposures.
- Depending on your lighting, various exposures can give different effects to your work.
- Make sure that your blacks and whites still retain detail.

Focus/Clarity:

- Your images should be clear and in focus. This is especially critical with artwork that has fine detail.
- The more textures and nuances the jurors can see, the more your craftsmanship will be appreciated and noticed.
- Macro photography can significantly enhance jewelry images.

Perspective: especially applies to jewelry, craft, glass, 3D, fiber

- Different angles can give off different moods and feelings for the artwork.
- Experiment with various angles.
- · Take many photos so you have a variety to chose from.

Backgrounds:


- Steer away from distracting backgrounds.
- If using a background, gradients and neutral colors work best.
- People, pets, banners, etc., can take away from your work.
- Each image is your chance to glorify your work. Remove any distracting elements.


My Portfolio is your media library.

You will need to upload at least 7 images to your portfolio to use in the application. One will be used as your artist guide image.

For each image, you will need to supply the title, medium, dimensions, and price.

Each image will need to be formatted & titled.

We do not require a booth shot.

All images uploaded to your portfolio must be formatted to the following specifications:

- •File name: Name your file, LAST name, FIRST name, AND NUMBER 1-6 (ex: Smith-John-1)
- •File format: Save all images as JPEG or JPG files
- •File size: Must be under 5.0 MB
- •File Resolution: 72-300dpi
- •Color space: RGB

Artist Guide image:

- File name: Name your file, LAST name, FIRST name, Guide (ex: Smith-John-Guide)
- File type: .tif or .jpg
- File format: CMYK is the preferred format; however, RGB is acceptable
- File resolution: Must be 300 dpi
- File size: 3.5" wide x 2.75" high (1050x850 px)

Draft it beforehand in Word/pages so you can easily check your character count; then copy & paste your text into the application.

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
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Once you've filled out all of the required fields click Continue.

At the bottom of the application, you select images from your Portfolio. As you add images, the system will tell you how many are still needed.

Once you've selected your seven, click Save & Preview.



Upload new images or choose images from your portfolio:


· Select an image from your portfolio by clicking on the thumbnail or checkbox next to the image.

- Upload a new image by selecting the Upload Image button in the Portfolio section.
- Your images will appear to jurors in the order you select them. Click the Reorder Images button to drag and drop the images into a different order.

Click Save & Preview to review your application before completing checkout.



HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

It costs \$40 to apply (non-refundable)

If you're invited to be part of the 2025 Tour:

- Returning artists pay a \$325 participation fee by 6/30
- First time artists pay a \$285 participation fee by 6/30

Staggered payment plans are available (June/July/August)

What do I get for my participation fee?

- Up to two full weekends to welcome the public to your studio and sell your artwork.
- Increased visibility and name recognition.
- \$20,000+ in print/online/radio ads throughout Santa Cruz County, Silicon Valley, and Monterey County.
- Listing in the Open Studios Artist Guide & app (22,000 free Guides & free app).
- Listing on the Open Studios webpage, including image and hyperlink to your website.
- Social media exposure through Arts Council Facebook & Instagram pages, e-blasts, and Arts Council newsletter.
- Preparation support for marketing and merchandising your work.
- A piece of your artwork in the Preview Exhibit at the Santa Cruz Art League where your art is seen by 4,000+ visitors (optional).

HOST STUDIO OPTIONS

If your studio is in a remote or inaccessible location, has little or no access to parking, cannot be made open to the public, or you're not sure where you'll be working on your art in October, you can be hosted by another Open Studios artist. Arts Council works with you to find just the right spot for you.

Watsonville-based artists:

We have secured space for 8 artists to hold their Open Studios inside the Porter Building and Watsonville Center for the Arts, both on Main Street in Watsonville.

Space will be available Oct. 4 & 5 and Oct. 18 & 19.
